A HISTORY OF BRITISH AIRWAYS FOOTBALL CLUB

Very little, if any, early history of the BA football team can be found except an entry in the initial minutes of the then Speedbird Club where the BA Football team was one of 6 other BA sections that were formed as part of the Sporting and Social Club for BOAC. So it seems that the earliest date we can verify is April 1947 for the BOAC team - no such evidence can be found for its counter part BEA .

What we do know is that the BOAC & BEA teams have played in various local leagues since the inauguration in 1947. As part of a UK Aviation review UK airlines were integrated into one airline; British Airways the United Kingdom's national airline, was formed in 1974 with the merger of the two largest UK airlines, British Overseas Airways Corporation (BOAC) and British European Airways (BEA), and also included two smaller regional airlines, Cambrian Airways and Northeast Airlines.

The merger was the completion of a consolidation process started in 1971 with the establishment of the British Airways Board, a body created by the British government to control the operations and finances of BOAC and BEA, which initially continued to exist as separate entities.

A HISTORY OF BRITISH AIRWAYS FOOTBALL CLUB

When BEA & BOAC merged in 1974 to become British Airways it took another 8 years before the teams amalgamated to become one all-encompassing British Airways Football Section this was driven by the sale of the the 'old' Silver Wing Club at Northolt to Ameretto's Country Club and all sporting activities from Northolt moved to the Concorde Centre (formerly Speedbird Club) at Heston.

The amalgamation of the two clubs created a huge football section with over 200 members. At that time there were approx 15 adult teams comprising of BA Staff from office workers to pilots from baggage handling to IT programmers.

The teams played in local leagues such as the Hanwell and District Mid Week League (folded many years ago) this mid week league was followed by the Airport League which has now also folded. The Sat teams played in the West Middlesex League (that has now also folded) the teams moved to the London Commercial League. This League had ten divisions at one time with at least 10 teams in each division and all the teams had to have their own sports grounds! All this has gone now with companies selling off the land the private developers or deciding that they couldn't afford to run sporting activities any longer, no wonder we are all getting fatter!

The Football teams at British Airways have had a very long, successful and proud history in Middlesex Junior football winning many league and county honours along the way. The BA Sat 1st team are probably one of the most successful teams: in Middlesex Junior football we have won the London Commercial League the Div 1 title and Senior League Cup on many, many occasions. The team have also been successful in the Middlesex County Intermediate Cup winning this cup 8 times and in 2005/06/07 this trophy was won 3 years running - a feat not equalled (so far!)-we have also had success in the Middlesex County Premier Cup winning the trophy in 1997 against a very strong Hayes Reserves XI.

Since moving to the Middlesex County League in 2007 we have won the Premier Div twice and finishing top of the Premier League we have now gained promotion to the Combined Counties League - a big step up for our Club, we hope to justify our promotion with a good showing in a first year. We will also be playing at Bedford and Feltham in our new ground share arrangement with Brian Barry and his team.

The club currently groundshare with Bedford & Feltham at The Orchard, having previously played at the Concorde Centre in Cranford.

FIRST TEAM UPDATE

Report- Gloucester City

Dorking Wanderers fought back from 3-1 down last Saturday versus Gloucester City to earn themselves a well-deserved replay in the 3rd qualifying round of the FA Cup. Wanderers started the brighter of the two teams, playing some good football right from the kick-off. However, despite the bright start Dorking conceded the first goal after playing out from the back and Luke Moore being dispossessed, which led to a corner which resulted in Gloucester taking the lead courtesy of Jake Jackson. Gloucester extended their lead in the 50th minute when a long ball caught out the Wanderers defence and Fabien Robert fired into the corner from 12 yards, however Dorking hit straight back only a minute later when Jason Prior scored the goal of the game following brilliant build up play by McShane and Richards, which led to Prior slotting it home to make it 2-1. The goals didn't stop there, and Gloucester restored their two goal cushion to make it 3-1 after 63 minutes, following another mistake by Wanderers when trying to play out from the back which led to a needless corner being conceded. Robert again was the man to punish Dorking. Even at 3-1 down the visitors refused to throw in the towel, and within 3 minutes Wanderers had reduced the deficit to 3-2 after a penalty was awarded following a foul by Robert on Lavery. Prior stepped up and calmly slotted home the penalty. The comeback was complete in the 80th minute when Kieran Lavery made it 3-3 with a towering header. Further chances fell to both sides to win the tie, however neither team could capitalise and the game ended 3-3, which appeared to be a fair result given the passage of play across the 90. After the match Manager Marc White said: "It was an all action game and a draw was a fair result on the day. It's positive that we have a chance in front of our own fans on Tuesday night, despite our growing injury list which remains a big concern given that so many of our key players are out of contention".

White added: "I have to say that our supporters were absolutely superb today. They travelled in numbers and got behind the team all game, and I'm sure this played a part in driving the lads forward even at 3-1 down"

COLLECTOR'S CORNER

Club Shop Manager Paul Manuel delves through his Football Programme Collection as well as keeping an eye on what items of interest are currently selling and what they are selling for.



Many conversations I have these days relate to whether or not our beloved match-day programme will soon become a distant memory. Many League clubs are now deciding not to print due to financial reasons. From what I am currently observing, an element of interest still remains and long may this continue.

I have to confess to being unable to find anything related to our visitors from British Airways today. So I decided to have a look at some football programmes that have recently sold at auction and share with you the prices they have been selling for.

This lovely old Chelsea Programme from the 1912/13 season shown below, covers an FA Cup 3rd Round 3rd Replay match played between West Ham and West Bromwich Albion. The match was played on Wednesday 22nd January 1913 at Stamford Bridge.

The Programme for that day is shown below:



The Programme sold at auction for £550. Note the lovely cartoon caption on the front cover. The moral depicting a lion representing Aston Villa waiting patiently for the outcome of the battle between a Throstle (WBA) and a man holding a hammer (West Ham). The words reading:- The Lion "What!! at it again. I wish they would settle it, 'pon my word I'm getting quite hungry again".

Older West Ham United Programmes have also been selling at very high prices recently. None more so than the one shown below.



Blackburn Rovers Programmes of this era are always rare, so culminated with the surge in interest in West Ham boosted the sale price of this Programme to £1270.79 when the hammer fell on this auction on the 13th July.

Manchester United are a very collectible club. This programme against Nottingham Forest back in 1932, sold at auction on the 28th August for £950.



The hope is that an interest in collecting still remains.

DORKING WANDERERS RESERVES FC HISTORY

Dorking Wanderers Football Club was established in 1999, and in a short space of time has steadily climbed the non-league pyramid from park football to the Bostik League. The club has recently moved to the newly constructed, multi million pound Meadowbank Stadium development in the heart of Dorking Town Centre.

The Dorking Wanderers Reserves have a firm commitment to develop local talent for the first team. Jordan has been instrumental in setting up the club's academy which competes with the very best in the South East of England and Peter works full time for the Football Association as a County Coach Developer, supporting coaches and their training throughout Surrey.

The Dorking Wanderers Reserves team replaces the Dorking Wanderers Development squad, who played in the Suburban League South Division 2017-2018 under the management of club legend Steven Lunn and the experienced youth coach Simon Coffey.

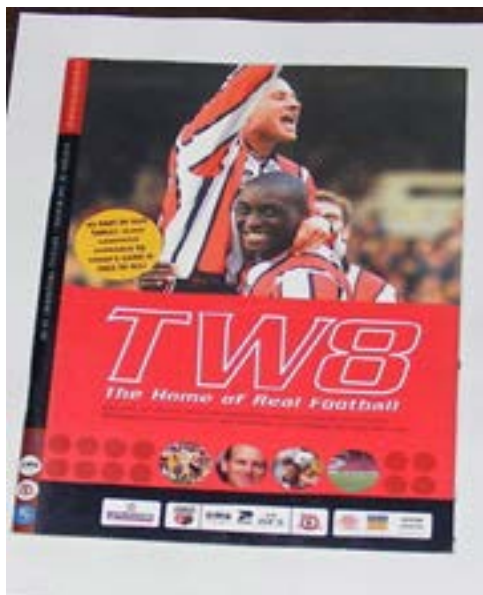

Football On This Day – 13th October 2001

In an attempt to increase interest in the club Brentford gave free admission to everyone who attended their Second Division match against Peterborough United on Saturday October 13th 2001. The 11,097 crowd (who would have paid about £70,000 if they had all been charged for entrance) was about twice the size of the previous home gate but sadly was also twice the size of their next game at Griffin Park. It was a season of nearly but not quite for Brentford finishing one point short of automatic promotion and then being beaten by Stoke in the Play Off final at the Millennium Stadium in Cardiff.



Football On This Day – 13th October 2004

Tofiq Bahramov will always be remembered with affection by England fans - he was the linesman who helped get awarded the controversial England third goal in the 1966 World Cup final. When his native Azerbaijan gained independence from the Soviet Union their national stadium was renamed in his honour complete with statue erected outside. England visited the stadium for the first time on this day in 2004 for a World Cup qualifier with captain Michael Owen scoring the only goal of the match.
