TODAY'S VISITORS



FRIMLEY GREEN

The club was founded in 1919 and currently play at Frimley Green Recreation Ground. The present clubhouse was erected in 1972 when 'The Green' played in the London Spartan League and used a pitch on the lower part of the park with the changing rooms where the car park now is. A few years later a new pitch was laid adjacent to the clubhouse and changing rooms were added. The Reserve Team joined the Combined Counties League in 1979 and at the start of the 1981/82 season the First Team switched across and Floodlights were installed for the first time. The Club competed in the League for a period of 15 years, during which time they won the Dan Air Elite Cup and the Reserves won the Division One Challenge Cup.

Due to the financial situation in 1994 the club voluntarily dropped down into junior football into the Surrey Intermediate League (Western). The next four seasons saw a period of rebuilding and repaying debts and the club were finally accepted into the Surrey Premier League in 1999, after finishing Runners-up and winning the League Cup. Off the field new Floodlights were installed and a Boardroom created.

A three-year spell followed, in the renamed Surrey Senior League, which saw the club finish fourth, sixth and Runners-up and attain promotion back into the Combined Counties League where they have played since. Season 2004-05 was the most successful to date, in the Combined Counties League, with the club finishing in 15th Place and amassing 58 points.

Season 2005-06 was very disappointing on the playing front but we managed to avoid finishing in a relegation position, however, despite substantial ground improvements we were demoted on 'ground grading', to make way for 7 clubs from the old Ryman Division two. In the next 4 seasons in Division One we had mixed fortunes, finishing 6th at the end of season 2007/08 but then in season 2008/09 finished 3rd from bottom but had our most successful season ever in the FA Vase, reaching the third round and won an FA Cup match for the first time. In season 2009/10 we managed to finish high enough up the table to retain our FA Cup place but 2010/11 was a poor season.

2011/12 saw the appointment of Paul Miles and Ian Maynard mid-season and in 2012/13 we won the Division One title and won 3 FA Vase games along the way. In 2013/14 Paul and Ian left us and Derren Martin.

2014/15 was a turbulent season which saw Derren Martin replaced by Paul Miles who in turn was replaced by Phil Ruggles & Andy Clement but they were unable to stop the slide in fortunes which led to relegation. 2015/16 saw another mid-table finish. At the start of 2016/17 there were further management changes with John Cook and Jamie Daltry coming in for 2017/18. Roland Baker joined the team and we narrowly missed out on promotion but did get our FA Cup place back.



Tom Richards' early goal was enough to give Dorking full points at the Fullicks Staduim, Richards drilled his shot in from the right and into the far corner of the net after being picked out by Luke Moore. Folkestone had started well Sam Hasler's first minute strike from Ronnie Dolan's pass flashed just wide. Dorking had a godd chance to increase their lead in the 16th minute when Moore found James Mcshane who put Sole clean through but Invicta goalkeeper rushed out to make an important save. Wands keeper Slavimor Huk then got down to make a good save at his near post to keep out a well struck 37th minute free-kick. Folkestone went despreratley close during stoppage-time at the end of the first half. Dolan's shot was initially saved by Huk's legs but Dolan reacted first to the loose ball and rounded Huk only for substitute Robb Sheridan to clear off the line. Huk made another good save on 74 minutes to deny Hasler, after Kieron McCann's shot was deflected into his path. Five minutes later, Dorking sub Tom Summerfield combined with McShane down the right but his shot flashed just wide. The score finished 1-0 to Dorking.





COLLECTOR'S CORNER

Club Shop Manager Paul Manuel delves through his Football Programme Collection as well as keeping an eye on what items of interest are currently selling and what they are selling for.



Many conversations I have these days relate to whether or not our beloved matchday programme will soon become a distant memory. Many League clubs are now deciding not to print due to financial reasons. From what I am currently observing, an element of interest still remains and long may this continue.

I have to confess to being unable to find anything related to our visitors from British Airways today. So I decided to have a look at some football programmes that have recently sold at auction and share with you the prices they have been selling for.

This lovely old Chelsea Programme from the 1912/13 season shown below, covers an FA Cup 3rd Round 3rd Replay match played between West Ham and West Bromwich Albion. The match was played on Wednesday 22nd January 1913 at Stamford Bridge.

The Programme for that day is shown below:



The Programme sold at auction for £550. Note the lovely cartoon caption on the front cover. The moral depicting a lion representing Aston Villa waiting patiently for the outcome of the battle between a Throstle (WBA) and a man holding a hammer (West Ham). The words reading:- The Lion "What!! at it again. I wish they would settle it, 'pon my word I'm getting quite hungry again".

Older West Ham United Programmes have also been selling at very high prices recently. None more so than the one shown below.



Blackburn Rovers Programmes of this era are always rare, so culminated with the surge in interest in West Ham boosted the sale price of this Programme to £1270.79 when the hammer fell on this auction on the 13th July.

Manchester United are a very collectible club. This programme against Nottingham Forest back in 1932, sold at auction on the 28th August for £950.



The hope is that an interest in collecting still remains.

DORKING WANDERERS RESERVES FC HISTORY

Dorking Wanderers Football Club was established in 1999, and in a short space of time has steadily climbed the non-league pyramid from park football to the Bostik League. The club has recently moved to the newly constructed, multi million pound Meadowbank Stadium development in the heart of Dorking Town Centre.

The Dorking Wanderers Reserves have a firm commitment to develop local talent for the first team. They are the final piece of the club's player pathway and ensure that the best local players have maximum opportunity to progress and represent their home town in the first team. The new team will compete in the Combined Counties League Division One, three tiers below Dorking's Bostik Premier League side.

The Dorking Wanderers Reserves team is managed by Jordan Clark and Peter Augustine.

Jordan has been instrumental in setting up the club's academy which competes with the very best in the South East of England and Peter works full time for the Football Association as a County Coach Developer, supporting coaches and their training throughout Surrey.

The Dorking Wanderers Reserves team replaces the Dorking Wanderers Development squad, who played in the Suburban League South Division 2017-2018 under the management of club legend Steven Lunn and the experienced youth coach Simon Coffey.



GAMES FROM THE PAST

ANCIENT GAMES THAT HAPPENED ON THIS DAY.

Football On This Day – 16th October 1968

The first attempt by an English side to win the Intercontinental Cup ended the same way as had Celtic's try the previous season - in a bad-tempered defeat by the champions of South America. After losing 1-0 in the first leg in Argentina - Nobby Stiles was sent off - European champions Manchester Unitedmet Estudiantes in the second leg in front of 63,500 at Old Trafford on this day in 1968. Juan Ramón Verón - the father of future United player Juan Sebastián Verón - scored for the visitors in the opening minutes, GeorgeBest was sent off and Willie Morgan equalised in the closing seconds so Estudiantes won the trophy 2-1 on aggregate.

Football On This Day – 16th October 2002

A gaffe from England's David Seaman brought more criticism for the Arsenal 'keeper when he allowed Macedonia's Artim Šakiri to score direct from a corner kick. Sakiri's inswinging corner was a routine effort, but Seaman revived memories of the blunder that sent England crashing out of the World Cup against Brazil by allowing the ball to drop behind him into the net. It handed Macedonia an early lead and gave them the perfect incentive as they hung on for a draw at The St Mary's Stadium. The 2-2 draw with Macedonia in a Euro qualifier at St Mary's in Southampton proved to be David Seaman's 75th and final appearance for his country.


