# TODAY'S VISITORS

## SHEERWATER

---

The London County Council started to build Sheerwater Estate in 1948, for families that wanted to move out of London and start a new life in Surrey. Around 1,380 houses were built at a cost of approximately £3 million. This prompted a community spirit from the early days, and football being the number one sport, came into effect when groups of men started having a kick around at the Sheerwater Recreation Ground, using their coats for goal posts. Sheerwater Football Club was founded in 1958 by early members of the club, the late John French (also player), Stan West, Ken May, Bill Hilleard, Herbert Taylor (also player), Syd Morris, Derrick Thomas, Jim McDermott and players Dennis Hill, John Murray, Micky Wedge, Chris Robinson, Jose Garcia, Tony Minchinton, Don Stevens, Michael French, Jim Kelly, to name a few. Sheerwater joined the local Woking & District League. We then progressed through the Divisions and obtained Intermediate status in the Surrey Intermediate (Western) League in the 1967-68 season. The club then progressed to senior level, and we were promoted to the Surrey Senior League for the 1972-73 season and a highest finish of 6th in the 1974-75 season. In 1978 following the loss of clubs to the London Spartan League, Hampshire clubs were admitted to the Surrey Senior League with the title of the competition eventually becoming the Combined Counties League. In 1981-82 the League had reached 22 members, and as a consequence was split into East and West divisions. In a dreadful season with only one win and one draw the club finished bottom of the East division, 16 points behind Clarion and both Sheerwater and Clarion were relegated to the newly formed Surrey Premier league. In our first season in this new league we had a highest position of 5th in 1982-83. However in 1984-85 we finished only above the bottom side Heath End Wanderers and another relegation followed. Unfortunately the vacancy at the lower level was a position in the Surrey Intermediate (Eastern) Division. Fortunately after one season in the Eastern Division we were allowed to transfer to the Surrey Combination Premier Division for the 1986-87 season, but we were relegated at the end of the season. After twice finishing third, we were Champions of Division One in 1989-90 and promoted to the Premier Division for 1990-91, finishing in a mid-table position. However in June 1991 The Surrey Combination and Surrey South Eastern Intermediate Leagues merged, but we were able to move sideways to the Surrey Intermediate (Western) League.

This was only for one season as we achieved promotion back to the Surrey Premier League. Our stay was, however, for only one season as we finished above bottom club Asstead, only on goal difference, and were relegated once more. Yet again this was only for one season. In 1994-95 we were back in the Surrey Premier League and finished 9th. After many discussions the Surrey Premier league became the first division of the Combined Counties league for the season 2003-04. We are still in the Division One League today, striving to maintain league standards with a small budget with few committee members and local helpers that maintain a good standard for the League. Although at present we are failing to meet the required Grade G with floodlights to stay in the League but we are part of the new Sheerwater Regeneration Programme that does not include a Recreation Ground or Athletic Club. We will be moving to a new facility on Sheerwater at the Bishop David Brown School in 2020 that will be up to the correct grading to continue in the Combined Counties League. Due to this delay the club has now agreed a two season ground share with Vanarama club Woking FC.

Five minutes in and Prior released the ball over to Richards who squared the ball over to Giuseppe Sole to slot home comfortably. Another move started by Prior led to JJ O'Sullivan running into the area to score the second two minutes later. Jason Prior added a third 8 minutes from time. Another clean sheet for Wanderers helped keep up the fine form as they move up to second in the table.

# DIRECTIONS TO SURREY FA AT MEADOWBANK FOOTBALL GROUND



## Arriving by Bus:

The nearest bus stop is The White Horse Stop K, marked above with the blue triangle) on Dorking High Street.

From this stop, the ground is a 5 minute walk. Cross over the road and head through St Martin's Walk, past Marks and Spencer and down past the car park towards the ground.

## Arriving by Train:

Dorking has three train stations in close proximity of Meadowbank Football Ground.

The station most convenient depends on where you begin your journey, and with the train operator you travel.

Walking from the station takes approximately:

- 8 minutes- Dorking West
- 10 minutes- Dorking Deepdene
- 12 minutes - Dorking Main

# COLLECTOR'S CORNER

**Club Shop Manager Paul Manuel delves through his Football Programme Collection as well as keeping an eye on what items of interest are currently selling and what they are selling for.**



Many conversations I have these days relate to whether or not our beloved matchday programme will soon become a distant memory. Many League clubs are now deciding not to print due to financial reasons. Many Non League Clubs like our Under 23 Combined Counties League team ( and most other clubs in this league ), have decided to go down the way of producing an “online programme”. From what I am currently observing, and in my case most thankfully an interest still remains and long may this continue. I have to confess to being unable to find anything that stands out relating to our visitors from Sheerwater today. Most of the stuff I have is from recent encounters against Dorking FC. So I decided to have a look at some football programmes that have recently sold or are currently selling at auction and share with you the prices they have been selling for.

Firstly, I found this lovely 1950's Ely City programme. The match in question was an FA Cup 1st Preliminary Round tie against Cambridge United. I just love the front cover of this programme.

The Programme for that day is shown below:



There is always an interest in League clubs playing against Non League Clubs in friendly or Reserve team matches.

I noticed this programme from a game played between Upminster FC & Arsenal 'A'. The game dates back to the 1947/48 season. Upminster produced a 4 page programme for this friendly match, played on Saturday 24th April 1948. By the way 4 page issues are very collectible, hence the fact that this sold for £216.00. Not a bad profit for those who may have purchased on the day for 2nd.



Lastly I found this Kings Lynn v Tottenham Hotspur 'A' programme from an Eastern Counties League Match played on 18th November 1950. This 3d programme sold for just shy of £90 at auction recently.

## Football On This Day – 23rd October 2011

Less than two months after the Old Trafford faithful had witnessed Manchester United's 8-2 demolition of Arsenal the boot was on the other foot in another Premier League match at the Theatre of Dreams - Manchester United 1 Manchester City 6. Manchester City inflicted Manchester United's worst home defeat since February 1955 as they thrashed the current champions at that time in ruthless fashion.



## Football On This Day – 23rd October 1963

A 100,000 full-house saw England v Rest of the World which was a 1963 association football match held at the Wembley Stadium in London. It was dedicated to the 100th anniversary of The Football Association and was the first time a world team played against a single nation. Jimmy Greaves was close to scoring for England several times in the first half, but failed due to laudable saves by Lev Yashin. In the second half, when Yashin was replaced by Milutin Šoškić, Greaves assisted Terry Paine to score in the 66th minute. Denis Law equalized 16 minutes later, but Greaves brought England to a last-minute victory. Greaves had the best game of his career and was considered as the best player of the match, while Yashin's saves had significantly contributed to his reputation of the world's best goalkeeper and earned him Ballon d'Or two months later.

## PERMITTED FOOTWEAR:



### Artificial Ground (AG)

RECOMMENDED

Specifically designed for extra abrasion, these boots usually feature more numerous and densely concentrated studs that vary in height and may be hollowed out.



### Firm Ground (FG)

RECOMMENDED

Sole plates feature moulded studs which are evenly dispersed across the foot to offer enhanced traction and comfort.



### Hard Ground (HG)

RECOMMENDED

Sole plates utilise a harder Thermoplastic polyurethanes compound for enhanced durability and typically feature multiple slightly shorter, evenly dispersed studs for optimal pressure distribution.



### Turf Trainer (TF)

ONLY WHEN DRY

Otherwise known as Astro's, they feature a solid rubber outsole with numerous, small multidirectional lugs spread across the sole, which offer limited grip in wet conditions.

## FORBIDDEN FOOTWEAR:



### Soft Ground (SG)

TEAR THE SURFACE

Sole features removable, replaceable screw-in studs and typically come in a six-stud configuration, with four at the forefoot and two at the heel.



### Soft Ground Pro (SGP)

TEAR THE SURFACE

Also known as Hybrid or Mixed Stud, the sole plate comprises of a combination of conical screw-in studs and moulded studs, which are most commonly bladed.



### Blades

CAN CAUSE INJURY

Sole plates feature multiple straight slightly shorter, evenly dispersed studs that can restrict movement and turning which could cause injury.



### Flat Sole (Indoor)

NO GRIP & FLATTEN SURFACE

Sole made up of non-marking materials such as moulded gum rubber and feature pivot points, flex grooves and herringbone patterns.
